Stockton University is nestled on nearly 2000 acres in the pristine southeastern New Jersey pinelands. Our program is TEAC-CAEP-accredited, and has received statewide praise for our strong clinical and co-teaching partnerships with school districts throughout southern New Jersey.

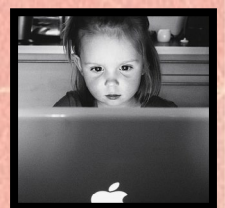
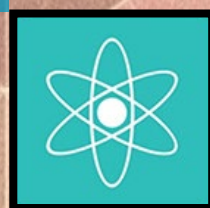
